She has a background in psychology and theology and has spent most of her career in the community development space. We hope this will be only one of many opportunities to hear how community based organisations have taken an initiative to involve themselves in infant mental health. All are welcome to attend, and we invite you to forward this information on to any friends and colleagues who may be interested.

Our group enjoyed a fascinating presentation by Jean Luyt last month, understanding adoption and the particular difficulties associated with transcultural adoption. There are still so many children who need adoption although the system is challenging. All children and especially those who are vulnerable, such as adopted children need to be affirmed by society that they are 'good enough'. We really appreciate the time and expertise Jean shared with us looking at this important topic.
