Greetings to all members and friends of WCAIMH.

Our July speakers, Dr. Meryl Forse and Dr. Rosie Dobel-Ober from Gateway Psychology presented on **Therapeutic Re-parenting**. Their TR-UST course (which stands for Therapeutic **R**e-parenting – Understanding, **S**upport, Techniques) utilizes attachment theory to provide adoptive parents, foster carers and residential caregivers a better understanding of ways to support the developing relationship with children in their care. Their course brings together current neuroscience knowledge, principles of effective interventions such as the Circle of security and practical techniques to facilitate attachment as well as understand challenging behaviors from an attachment point of view.

We are very excited to announce that **Ben Truter** will be the speaker at our next talk on **Thursday 15 August**. Ben is a Clinical Psychologist with over 13 years' experience in the field of Autism Spectrum Disorders (ASD). He is the co-founder and Clinical Director of **Neurodiversity Centre**, a multi-disciplinary group that specializes in conditions on the Autism Spectrum and related neurodevelopmental conditions. They have centres in Groot Drakenstein, Durbanville, Worcester and Somerset West. Ben widely delivers training in ASDs and is the sole Licence holder in Africa for training professionals in the DISCO diagnostic framework.

The talk will focus on **Autism** and it will address among other things, the presentation of Autism in infants and young children, the impact on parents, as well as the importance of thorough developmental assessment across all domains, in children with any neurodevelopmental presentation.

World Breastfeeding Week: 1-7 August

The theme of this year's World Breastfeeding Week is **"Empower Parents, Enable Breastfeeding.**" UNICEF and WHO is calling on governments and employers to promote 'family-friendly' policies in order to facilitate breastfeeding. Their recommendations focus on working parents, highlighting the challenges that mothers face when returning to work while trying to continue breastfeeding. Suggestions for at least 18 weeks of paid maternity leave, and paternity leave aims to encourage shared responsibility of caring for children on an equal basis. In addition, the need for access to a parent-friendly workplace to protect and support mothers' ability to continue breastfeeding upon return to work and affordable childcare should be prioritised.

A recent study from the Institute for Health Metrics and Evaluation (IHME) at the University of Washington's School of Medicine showed that only 3 African countries are expected to meet the WHO global target for exclusive breastfeeding of 6 months (DOI: 10.1038/s41591-019-0525-0). South Africa is unfortunately not one of them.
