Greetings to all members and friends of WCAIMH!

We were fortunate to have **Nicki Dawson** from **Ububele** present at our September meeting. As the head of the **Umdlezane Parent Infant programmes** at Ububele, she gave an overview of the services offered and presented some of the findings from her PhD studies. The Parent Infant services at Ububele includes the Ububele Baby Mat Service, the Ububele Home Visiting Project, Newborn Behavioural Interventions and Newborn Consultations, as well as parent-infant psychotherapy.

Nicki highlighted how the construct of **maternal sensitivity** as it is currently assessed, does not account for all cultural practices. Her work with mothers in Alexandra township has emphasized the need to question how maternal sensitivity is assessed within the South African context. The use of lay counsellors from the community who provide home visiting was also beautifully illustrated with video material. More information can be found at: https://ububele.org/

We are pleased to welcome **Brenda Cowley** and **Prof. Astrid Berg** as our speakers on **Thursday 17 October**.

Brenda Cowley is an **Educational Psychologist** and **psychotherapist** with a background in psychoanalytic psychotherapy. She has been in private practice in Cape Town for the past 27 years working with children in play therapy and adults in long term individual psychotherapy.

Over the past 8 years her field of interest has broadened to include the area of infant mental health, including parent/infant psychotherapy. In 2018 she qualified with an **MPhil degree** in **Infant Mental Health** through the University of Stellenbosch. During this time, she developed an interest in the crucial **role that fathers** can play in enhancing the healthy development of their infants. Her masters dissertation looked specifically at the **quality of father-infant play interaction** and formed part of a larger study entitled **"Theatre for Babies: Enhancing paternal awareness of infants' abilities and facilitating shared pleasure"** run by **Prof Astrid Berg.**

She and Prof. Berg will be presenting the film of the baby show "**Scoop**" as performed by the Magnet Theatre and the findings that emanated from this.

Landmark court ruling

- WCAIMH welcomes the ruling by the Constitutional Court that found the defense of reasonable and moderate parental chastisement of children as unconstitutional. We support discipline practices that **promote understanding of infant and child experiences, foster emotional development** and **respects the rights of infants and children**.
- We acknowledge the **need to support parents** in their discipline practices and commit ourselves to helping parents find alternative ways of responding to children.
- At the **November AGM**, we will be having a **broader discussion** about the ruling and welcome all members and interested parties to attend the meeting on **Thursday 21 November**.
